TEEN BEAT

Did you see what happened last night (Tuesday)? In the world of Basketball, the championship game I mean. No, not the NBA, their playoffs last another 8 months or so. But in Croatia, one of the countries that regularly gives the USA fits in international play, it was the final game of their championship series last night and it was a really crazy finish.

To sum it all up, the team that was leading by 1 with about 4 seconds to go was at the free-throw line where they missed both shots. The other team grabbed the ball and, after weaving through several defenders, loosed an outside shot which drained through the bucket with 0.6 seconds left to give them the two point lead. Immediately the players started celebrating, running around the court with arms upraised as the home crowd cheered and waved and jumped, and shouted.

The trouble was, those 0.6 seconds. You see, while they were celebrating their victory, their opponent inbounded the ball and launched a final heave-ho shot that ripped through the net and stole the victory and the championship. And the TV cameras and announcers were oblivious until the "loosing team" started to celebrate. One camera that was down low, behind one team's bench caught part of the shot (the rest was blocked by the celebration) or quite possibly no one would have even seen what happened unless they were at the game.

I Peter 5:4-11 sets the same scenario spiritually. We see the greatest victory of all, eternal life and a crown of righteousness promised as a reward. But then, lest we celebrate victory too soon, we are given a sobering reminder about our opponent. It says:

"And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away. Young men, in the same way be submissive to those who are older. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

Be self-controlled and alert. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that your brothers throughout the world are undergoing the same kind of sufferings. And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. To him be the power for ever and ever. Amen."

The challenge is clear: trust God and serve him only and always. And never become so confident in what we have done that we leave our defenses down. Otherwise, our victory may be stolen. Never-the-less we can have blessed assurance in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Wanda Vernon is in room 239 at Clay County Memorial Hospital.

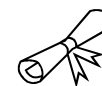
